New tool predicts ice accumulations

n a disaster scenario, preparedness is everything.

A new weather tool available to utilities nationwide promises to be— if not a game changer for electric cooperative ground forces—at the very least a tremendously useful tool in the arsenal of storm readiness.

Created by veteran electric cooperative professional Sid Sperry and meteorologist Steve Piltz, the Sperry-Piltz Ice Index charts and predicts the potential severity of ice storms in similar fashion to hurricane forecasting. By studying maps of predicted ice accumulations and wind speeds in particular areas, electric co-op personnel can assess with greater accuracy where outages and damage are more likely to occur.


Dennis Krueger, Kiwash Electric Cooperative general maanger, said he reviewed the Ice Index when it was in the design stage . "While we have great expectations that this will help us, until we get hit with an ice storm and are able to use the Ice Index to its full potential, we won't really know," he said.

With the tools of the Ice Index, Kiwash personnel can watch a storm approach and determine which parts of co-op service are more likely to experience heavy ice. "If we can know that information even 24 to 48 hours in advance, we can mobilize contractors, and get extra materials ordered if necessary," Krueger said.



Kiwash Electric has experienced two major ice storms in the past eleven years. A 2001 storm destroyed 4,200 poles and caused widespread outages. Another storm occurred in December 2009. Similar disasters across the state prove to coops—and consumers —that Mother Nature does not play nice with ice. "The more prepared we are when a storm arrives, the more efficient we will be in restoring power to our members," he said.

Recipe Box



White Chocolate Raspberry Cheesecake

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup chocolate cookie crumbs
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons white sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/2 cup half-and-half cream
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 tablespoons white sugar
- 1 (10 oz) pkg frozen raspberries
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 2 cups white chocolate chips
- 3 (8 oz) pkgs cream cheese, softened
- 3 eggs

DIRECTIONS

In a medium bowl, mix together cookie crumbs, 3 tablespoons sugar, and melted butter. Press mixture into the bottom of a 9 inch springform pan.

In a saucepan, combine raspberries, 2 tablespoons sugar, cornstarch, and water. Bring to boil, and continue boiling five minutes, or until sauce is thick. Strain sauce through a mesh strainer to remove seeds.

Preheat oven to 325°F. In a metal bowl over a pan of simmering water, melt white chocolate chips with half-and-half, stirring occasionally until smooth.

In a large bowl, mix together cream cheese and 1/2 cup sugar until smooth. Beat in eggs one at a time. Blend in vanilla and melted white chocolate. Pour half of batter over crust. Spoon 3 tablespoons raspberry sauce over batter. Pour remaining cheesecake batter into pan, and again spoon 3 tablespoons raspberry sauce over the top. Swirl batter with the tip of a knife to create a marbled effect.

Bake for 55 to 60 minutes, or until filling is set. Cool, cover with plastic wrap, and refrigerate for 8 hours before removing from pan. Serve with remaining raspberry sauce. Yield: One 9-inch cheesecake.
